About Building Future Industry Leaders (BFIL)



The BFIL program partners with manufacturers in Aerospace/Robotics, Diesel Mechanics, Marine & and Vessel Technology, Diesel Mechanics, Construction, and Transportation – Green jobs, (CDL) Training Certification to participate in Washington State economic and sustainability initiatives.
